Quietly over the past decade, Montepeloso's Fabio Chiarelotto has emerged as one of the towering winemakers of the Tuscan coast. His windy site sits above the famed Tua Rita estate in Suvereto, producing red wines that are among the region's most refined. The terroir itself is extraordinary: hillsides around the town of



Suvereto. The zone's petrified clay soils, and its proximity to the sea, give a startling intensity of flavor to wines. It's little wonder that half a dozen estates have sprung up over the past 20 years though, by contrast, most are planted in the heavier clays of the valley floor. From the beginning, Suvereto's challenge to Bolgheri—as Tuscany's premier source of Super Tuscans—has come from just two adjacent estates: Tua Rita and Montepeloso.

The properties enjoy two of the best terroirs in Italy: Montepeloso on a gentle hillside of chalky gravel and clay, and Tua Rita in heavier clay below. Climatically warmer than interior Tuscany-and possessing a marked similarity to St. Emilion's famed Côtes - this locale naturally limits yields and is capable of producing wines with great concentration and perfume. While a unique site is important for great wine, an inspired winemaker is also required. The introspective Chiarelotto had little interest in the guidance of fashionable enologists. He was determined to follow his own path and he brought with him a clear vision of the singular wines he felt the estate could yield. His obsession is such that we find few others with which to compare him. The person he most reminds us of is the great Montalcino iconoclast, Gianfranco Soldera. Like Soldera, Chiarelotto remains driven by his own philosophies, possessing an obsessive commitment to quality, with an apparent disinterest in what others think of him or his wines.

30% Montepulciano, 30% Cabernet Sauvignon,

20% Sangiovese, 10% Marselan,

10% Alicante. Four months in second passage barriques.

2018/2021 Montepeloso 'Eneo' Rosso



45% Sangiovese, 35% Montepulciano, 15% Alicante and 5% Marselan. Harvested by hand in the first two weeks in October. Grapes are 100% de-stemmed. No filtration. Aged in second, third and fourth passage barriques.
