Founder/Winemaker: Pascal Lavergne

Known For: Recognized as a passionate hard-worker, Pascal is also very well known in the region for cattle farming for which he is regularly awarded. He's also a community activist serving as a council member and Mayor of Monségur.

Pascal Lavergne is known by his childhood nickname "Cal-hou" which is a play on the French word 'caillou' meaning pebble. When he acquired his 12 hectares of vineyards in a place called «Belair» at St. Gemme, near Monségur in Bordeaux, he looked at the pebbly soil and naturally associated his nickname with the

area's name. Château Calhou Belair wines are created in what he believes to be his image: generous, simple, and friendly. All wines are estate bottled.



2018/2019 Chateau Calhou Belair Bordeaux

55% Merlot, 35% Cabernet Sauvignon, 10% Cabernet Franc grown on clay and limestone soils. Temperature controlled in stainless steel. Aged in concrete vats. Highlighted with licorice and sweet spices. A friendly, velvety, and soft palate boasting wonderful balance, that is both vinous and fruity. Wood box available!
