White Blended Rum

Buckle up, folks—this is a tale of two islands, one phenomenal rum, and a history that's almost as layered as the rum itself. When you think of the Caribbean, you might picture palm trees, turquoise waters, and maybe even Jack Sparrow swinging from a mast. But for those in the know, the Caribbean is hallowed ground for rum, with each island offering its own take on this legendary spirit. Enter Probitas—a blended white rum that's breaking boundaries as the first-ever collaboration between two iconic distilleries from different Caribbean islands: Foursquare in Barbados and Hampden Estate in Jamaica.

Probitas is a blend of three rums: an unaged pot still rum from Hampden (the funky, ester-laden superstar of Jamaica), and two rums from Foursquare - a 2-year-aged pot still and an unaged column still. Probitas isn't just about one flavor - it's an entire experience. From the first whiff, you're hit with a cascade of tropical fruits - think ripe plantains, strawberry cream, and a hint of spiced mascarpone. And it doesn't stop there. On the palate, the rum explodes with flavors of grassy, underripe mango, silky coconut oil, and marzipan. The finish? Oh, it's a showstopper: grilled pineapple with a dusting of black pepper and allspice. If this doesn't make you dream of Caribbean sunsets and beach bonfires, I don't know what will. If you're serious about rum - or even if you're just rum-curious - Probitas is a bottle you need to get your hands on. It's versatile enough for cocktails but complex enough to be sipped neat. At 47% ABV, it's got the guts to hold its own in a punchy Tiki drink, yet it's smooth enough to stand alone in a glass. And for the price? It's a steal.
