Fun Fact: Willett Distillery is also known as Kentucky Bourbon Distillers (KBD).

In 1936, Thompson Willett founded the Willett Distillery which was erected on the family’s farm, three short years after the repeal of prohibition. Today, the tradition continues. Right outside of Bardstown, you’ll find the historic Willett Distillery—an independent, family-owned and quintessential Kentucky experience. From the underground, spring-fed lakes, to the Kentucky split-face limestone exterior, to the old turn-of-the-century belt and pulley fan



systems running throughout the distillery and visitor center, it truly makes for a memorable trip. John David Willett (born in 1841) had been the master distiller for the Moore, Willett & Frenke Distillery, which he had formed with his brother-in-law Thomas S. Moore of Bardstown, and a Mr. Frenke of Louisville. In 1876, Willett fell ill and sold his interest in the company. Starting at the age of 15 with a five-year stint at the Mattingly Moore Distillery, his son A. Lambert Willett (born in 1883) picked up his father’s profession. Lambert Willett then worked for the Max Selliger & Co. Distillery for twenty years – eventually becoming one-third owner and superintendent of the plant. A. L. "Thompson" Willett, Lambert’s son (born in 1909), also joined him at the plant as assistant superintendent. Lambert Willett later purchased a farm and, together with his sons and especially led by Thompson Willett, founded the Willett Distilling Company on the site. Thompson and Lambert Willett used John David Willett’s bourbon recipes as the basis of the whiskey that they

would distill there and brand as Old Bardstown. On September 19, 2019, Even Kulsveen was inducted into the Kentucky Bourbon Hall of Fame and recognized with a Parker Beam Lifetime Achievement Award by the KDA, who described Kulsveen as "a beloved icon who patiently resurrected one of the state’s most historic distilleries and returned the family-owned brand to global prominence." To this day, descendants of Thompson Willett are still carrying on the family tradition of making fine Kentucky Bourbon and Kentucky Rye Whiskey at the same spot that Thompson and his family operated over 80 years ago.



Willett Family Estate Pot Still Reserve Bourbon



Willett Pot Still Reserve was originally introduced as a single barrel beginning in 2008. A very graceful bourbon. Without a doubt a must-try for any bourbon lover. Nose is "vanilla lemon cake." The palate is a balance of caramel, vanilla, spices and citrus. Very subtle and complex and always shows a soft mintiness framed by some fresh vanilla and a round, rich body.

Each batch is bottled at cask strength without chill filtration. A robust rye with dark cherry, burnt vanilla, and spices for days. It's a delicious rye with a weighty

mouthfeel. It's insanely well balanced with the alcohol so perfectly integrated at 115 proof you'll forget it's there, but you'll find yourself smiling more and happier with each dram.

Willett Family Estate Noah's Mill Small Batch Bourbon



One of the most lush and rich whiskeys on the market. Noah's Mill is a handmade, small-batch Kentucky bourbon with unique character and a smoothness rarely found in young whiskeys.

Willett Family Estate Rowan's Creek Small Batch Bourbon

Named after the creek that runs through the distillery. Bringing your nose to the glass and your olfactory is treated to caramel and vanilla layered on herbal and floral notes. The mouthfeel starts oily but finishes dry. On the palate you are treated to sweet caramel, vanilla, dusted in floral notes finishing notes of oak and a lingering spiciness.

Willett Family Estate Old Bardstown Estate Bottled Straight Bourbon Whiskey



Nose is sweet, herbal, citrus. The palate is herbaceous, sweet fruit, vanilla, on a layer of oak and earthiness that goes on like a champion marathon runner.

Willett Family Estate Old Bardstown Straight Bourbon Whiskey



A classic Bourbon. On the nose, caramel, oak, vanilla, and just a hint of floral notes. The palate follows with more of the same. A softer style Bourbon, this is a great gateway dram to converting someone to becoming a Bourbon drinker.

Willett Family Estate 8-Year Straight Bourbon Whiskey



Distilled from a mixture of corn, wheat and malted barley. The first release of Willett Wheated Bourbon was distilled in the early Spring of 2013 and bottled in the Summer of 2022. The proprietary mash bill is barreled at 115 proof in Char# 4 American oak. We bottle without chill-filtration to preserve the most flavor possible.



Johnny Drum Private Stock Straight Bourbon

According to the bottle's label, Johnny Drum served as a drummer boy in the year 1861 during the Confederate (Civil) War. At the end of the war, legend has it Johnny returned home to his native Kentucky, where he staked claim among a beautiful spring. Johnny learned the importance of finding a way to convert his excess corn crop into a profitable item, rather than allowing it to go to waste. As the story goes, it wasn't long before Johnny's determination produced an exceptional bourbon whiskey. The nose is sour apple, vanilla, and oak. The palate is a snowball rolling over fruits, vanilla, and spices, mixing them all together into a well-balanced and complex Whiskey.



Kentucky Vintage Straight Bourbon

Kentucky Vintage is a label bottled by Kentucky Bourbon Distillers, the parent company of Willett, as part of their Small Batch Boutique Bourbon collection. Amber, with a golden cast. Medium-bodied. Buttery, smooth texture. Attractive in its viscosity and warmth of the palate. Nicely balanced by whiffs of campfire scents, soft fruit notes, and a light streak of fragrance.



Pure Kentucky Straight Bourbon

Kentucky, USA- Pure Kentucky is an all natural product. Made with all natural ingredients and pure limestone water, it is a true masterpiece among Kentucky's finest Bourbons. This bourbon is hand-bottled, extra old, in very limited quantities, one small batch at a time. Aptly named, because when you think of Kentucky, you think Bourbon. The nose is toffee, fruit, eucalyptus and oak. The palate is cinnamon, toffee, caramel, pepper, oak, and spices.
