Field Recordings is the winemaker-run label of Andrew Jones, born from his two decades of working in the vine-nursery world on California’s Central Coast. With an eye for under-appreciated vineyard sites, he founded Field Recordings in 2007 to document “the people and places I value most” through wine. Based in Tin City, Paso Robles, the program sources from some of the region’s most interesting and quietly performing vineyards - organic or sustainably farmed, often dry-farmed, always chosen with intention. Andrew makes wines that speak of place, but above all speak of flavor: native-yeast ferments, minimal sulfur, zero pretension. At Field Recordings you’ll find everything from skin-contact whites and pét-nats to serious barrel-aged reds and everyday-drink blends - all wrapped in a label and a brand designed for accessibility and authenticity. With most wines retailing in the \$25 range, and many club members and visitors remarking on their freshness and value, the brand occupies a distinct space: elevated yet un-elevated, thoughtful yet fun. Field Recordings is expanding vineyard ownership, refining organic certification, and maintaining a tasting room that welcomes dogs, families and curious visitors alike. In a winemaking world that often privileges flash and hype, Field Recordings delivers quiet, grounded wines with personality.



2021 ‘Champs’ Sparkling Wine, Paso Robles

Varietals: 100% Pinot Meunier
Vineyards: Derbyshire

To expand on our sparkling wine-making skills we started a methode champenoise in 2020 using this underdog sparkling grape from the old world that is the only of its kind grown on the SLO Coast. On tirage for 30 months and disgorged in July of 2023. Enjoy, this is our toast to you!



2024 Chenin Blanc, Central Coast

Varietals: 100% Chenin Blanc

Vineyards: Shell Creek (organic), Jurassic Park (sustainable), Chalone

Fermentation: Hand-picked and pressed directly to barrel for a spontaneous fermentation

Élevage: 4 months in 1000l German fuder and 228l neutral French oak

Tasting Notes: Meyer lemon, fresh quince, zest of lime, oyster shells, chamomile



2022 Rosé Pet Nat, Paso Robles

“Field Recordings buy grapes from all over the Central Coast of California and almost always makes interesting wines that are not intended to make statements, just to satisfy. This savory, energetic pétillant naturel rosé, a blend of cabernet franc and chardonnay, is typical. It’s made using the ancient method of creating sparkling wines, simply bottling the wine before fermentation is complete. The resulting carbon dioxide, with no way to escape the bottle, creates the gentle bubbles that enliven this wine.”

Varietals: 86% Cabernet Franc, 14% Chardonnay

Vineyards: Wine Porch (organic), Cat Canyon (organic), Madison, Magdalena

Fermentation: Crushed and left on skins for 6 hours and pressed to stainless. Fermented cold with native yeast and bottled before fermentation is complete to get just the right amount of sparkle

Tasting Notes: Oxnard plains strawberries, fresh rosemary sourdough loaves and a hint of jade citrus mint tea, watermelon jolly rancher.



‘Salad Days’ Sparkling Wine

A truly unique sparkling wine experience made from organic California grapes. Raw, vibrant and ready to take on anything. Moving forward thru vinification. On to greener pastures. 100% organic ingredients.

Fermented in stainless steel for 45 days to preserve fresh and tropical flavors tasting of gooseberry, lychee, bartlett pears.

Varietals: 32% Chenin Blanc, 14% Malvasia Bianca, 12% Pinot Gris, 11% Pinot Blanc, 10% Vermentino, 8% Trousseau Gris, 4% Albariño, 3% Sémillon, 2% Verdelho, 2% Picpoul Blanc, 1% Colombard, 1% Gros Manseng

Vineyards: Martin Brothers (Organic), Trousdale, Cat Canyon (Organic), Greengate Farms, Lockwood Valley, George Brown, Huerhuero, Shell Creek (Organic), Jurassic Park, Nolan, Creston Ridge (Organic), Millhouse (Organic), Zabala (Organic), Hinterland (Organic)

Fermentation: White grapes are destemmed and left on skins for 23 to 46 days.

Élevage: 100% barrel aged for 4 months in neutral French oak

91 Points - Vinous - *“Opens with a vivid bouquet that recalls sun tea and blood orange. It is sweet upon entry, with a liquid floral concentration that saturates the senses as nuances of apricot and melon swirl throughout. Fresh and medium in length, the 2024 finishes with a hint of candied citrus.”*

2024 'Shucks' White Wine

65% Pinot Blanc, 35% Melon from Chalone Vineyard. Directly pressed to neutral barrels for a spontaneous fermentation. 4 months in neutral French oak. Flavors of lemon creme, shortbread cookies, white flowers.

In the mountains above Soledad, at the base of the Pinnacles National Monument, lies the 50-year-old La Puesta block. At a time when varieties were mixed up, the Melon grapes were originally planted as “Pinot Blanc.” Gradually, the vines were replanted with true Pinot Blanc, and today, the actual vineyard mix is unknown. We get a random assortment, picked early in the season to ensure the freshest possible acidity. Aged on its lees until bottling for added richness and complexity while retaining that laser-sharp acidity. Grab your shucking knives.

2025 'Bumps' Sauvignon Blanc, Santa Maria Valley

100% Sauvignon Blanc. Hand picked and pressed whole clustered to stainless steel for a long and cool fermentation with native yeast. Double racked after fermentation to keep the aromatics popping and fresh. Half of the wine is then aged in neutral barrels for 4 months before getting blended back with the crisp stainless steel portion for the perfect amount of balance.



2024 'Fiction' Red Wine, Paso Robles

Varietals: 21% Cinsaut, 17% Lagrein, 16% Cabernet Franc, 13% Charbono, 10% Cabernet Sauvignon, 9% Sangiovese, 6% Alicante Bouschet, 4% Zinfandel, 2% Grenache, 2% Trousseau

Vineyards: Koligian, Hinterland (Organic), Trousdale (Organic), Loomis (Organic), Wilderness, Vukelich, Bordonaro, Greengate

Fermentation: Fermented as whole berries; depending on the lot, we use 10-20% stems for added structure and spice. Punchdowns and/or pumpovers twice daily to keep the native yeast fermentation healthy and happy.

Élevage: 10 months in both American and French oak, 20% new

93 Points – '23 James Suckling - *“The nose offers an array of bright, lifted aromas of mulberries, cocoa and violets. The palate is medium-bodied with firmly integrated tannins and fresh acidity, showing notes of blood plums, raspberries, dark chocolate and licorice.”*



2024 'Wonderwall' Pinot Noir, Santa Barbara County

Vineyards: Garey Anch, Maria Vista, Yellow Foxtrot

Fermentation: Fully destemmed and fermented in stainless steel with 1 pump over per day to gently extract flavors through fermentation

Élevage: 7 months in French oak, 10% new

Tasting Notes: Raspberry, black cherries, Ceylon cinnamon, black pepper



2023 'Franc' Cabernet Franc, Paso Robles

Varietals: 100% Cabernet Franc

Vineyards: Hinterland (Organic), Bordonaro

Fermentation: open top bins with 33% stem inclusion

Élevage: 8 months in American oak casks

Tasting Notes: blueberries, black cherries, red currants and a touch of mint and rosemary

92 Points - James Suckling - *“Not your traditional California cabernet franc. This leans more toward a Loire Valley style, with fresh, lifted aromas of wild blackberries, cassis, violets and potpourri. The palate is medium-bodied with fine tannins and bright acidity, showing notes of cranberries, pencil shavings and fresh herbs. Very well balanced and vibrant.”*



2024 'Freddo' Chillable Red , Paso Robles

Varietals: Varietals: 100% Sangiovese

Vineyards: Creston Ridge (Sip Certified), Trousdale (Sip Certified),

Tasting Notes: Tastes like fresh cranberry, Montmorency cherries, strawberry

This wine was fermented with native yeasts in sealed stainless steel tanks under pressure of CO² for two weeks. After pressing, the wine finished its fermentation in stainless steel tanks before being racked off of its lees into tanks to age. Minimal sulfur was added after malolactic fermentation and again before bottling.

The ideal antipasto wine! We recommend serving with a chill — when the letters on the label turn blue, you know what to do (drink it).

91 Points – James Suckling – *“Bursting with charm, this shows red cherries, cranberries and rhubarb swept with fresh oregano and spices, plus a subtle lift of fennel seeds through the mouthwatering finish. This light, bracing red is meant to be enjoyed chilled; the word “Freddo” on the label turns blue when it’s properly cold.”*



2023 'Super Gnario' Red Wine, Happy Canyon

'The 15 Best Wines in 2023 So Far' -The Tasting Table

Produced with two grapes that aren't regularly associated with California: Nebbiolo and Barbera. Nebbiolo features predominantly, proving that the star variety of Italy's prestigious Barolo wines is at home on this side of the Atlantic.

Varietals: 70% Nebbiolo, 30% Barbera

Vineyards: Alta Gaviota, Mora

Fermentation: Open top fermentation in 1.5 ton bins for 17-47 days. 14 months in French oak, 10% new.

Tasting Notes: Luxardo cherries, rustic fruit punch, iron oxide, garrigue

Élevage: 14 months in 100% French oak (10% new).



2023 'Domo Arigato (Mr. Ramato)' Orange Wine, Central Coast

Varietals: A Ramato-style wine made from skin-contact Pinot Gris (hence the name). We used a special barrel selection of our Pinot Gris lots used for Skins.

Vineyards: Greengate Farms

Fermentation: Destemmed and fermented on skins for 36 days before pressing to neutral barrels

Elevage: 4 months in neutral French oak

Tasting Notes: Freeze dried strawberry, fresh apricot, hint of thyme



2023 'About Time' Organic Merlot, Paso Robles

This organic Merlot from Paso Robles got the white glove treatment from our team. Minimal pumpovers and processing to keep some nice fresh fruit flavors. All the things you want out of a daily drinking claret for your dining table.

Varietal: Merlot
Vineyards: Castoro Estate
Fermentation: Open top tanks for 14 days with daily pumpovers
Elevage: 5 months in stainless steel, 5 months in neutral oak
Tasting Notes: Vanilla spice latte, plum sauce, tobacco leaf



2023 'Regenerator' Organic Zinfandel

Classic California Zinfandel that showcases the spicy side of Zin while holding onto its bright berry flavors. Good to go with everything from burgers to filet mignon.

Varietal: Zinfandel
Fermentation: Open top tanks for 14 days with daily pumpovers
Elevage: 10 months in American oak, 25% new
Tasting Notes: Black licorice, plums, Urfa pepper



2024 'Fiasco' Red Blend, Paso Robles

Varietal: 75% Cabernet Sauvignon, 25% Sangiovese
Vineyards: Armory, The Wilderness, Creston Ridge, Trousdale
Fermentation: 14-21 days in open top bins and punched down twice daily
Elevage: 10 months in French oak (10% new)
Tasting Notes: muddled red raspberry, a hint of rust, the essence of menthol, fancy yet casual

92 Points – James Suckling- *“Nervy and full of energy, showing tobacco leaves and brambleberries that are dusted with Mediterranean herbs and dried lavender. Precise and mineral through the vivid finish.”*



2025 'Pizza Nights' Gamay, Central Coast

100% Gamay. We partially de-stemmed the fruit into open top bins. Punched down the native fermentation twice a day until dryness. Pressed to neutral oak barrels for 6 months of aging before bottling with a light filtration and minimal sulfur. Your neighborhood pizza joint is truly the perfect slice of Americana: A warm, welcoming environment of friends and families appreciating life over a bowl of meatballs, a few pizzas, and a couple salads. A relaxing long table, some good laughs, kids bouncing back and forth to beg for extra quarters to pump into the arcade machines. It doesn't even matter that it's midweek and you've got a laundry list of things to do tomorrow. Life is good and you appreciate the moment. This collaboration was crafted and conceptualized with our friends at Talula's Pizza in Asbury Park, New Jersey, over a few of their signature sourdough pies, a couple of mozzarella sticks, and a nice chilled glass of vino.

2022 'All the Rage'



"All the Rage" is a fantastic red wine that packs a flavorful punch. Made from a blend of organic Cabernet Sauvignon (65%), Merlot (20%), Syrah (10%), and Marselan (5%) grapes grown in two vineyards (Coquilot and Deboem) in Santa Barbara County - one of them young and the other over three decades old, the wine offers a depth of character that is rich and complex. 100% neutral French oak. On the nose, the wine is vibrant with aromas of black cherry, red currant, and hints of chocolate. On the palate, the wine is silky, with a balanced acidity and tannins that are firm yet smooth. The flavors are bold and fruit-forward, with distinct notes of ripe plum, blackberry, and a touch of vanilla. Bottled without any fining, this wine maintains its true flavor and is ideal for those who appreciate organic wine. Stylistically similar to a Bordeaux village, "All the Rage" is bold yet elegant, perfect for pairing with grilled meats or hearty pasta dishes. It's an impressive wine that will make you the life of the party and satisfy even the most discerning of palates. **Organic/Vegan!**

2022 'Soft Eyes' Rosé

'Soft Eyes' Rosé is a beautiful, organic wine made from Grenache (93%) and Marselan (7%) grapes from Deboem Vineyard in Santa Barbara County. Native yeast fermentation in tank. Aged in 100% stainless steel. On the nose, this wine is bursting with bright aromas of fresh strawberries, crisp watermelon, and subtle notes of juicy citrus fruits. The palate is dominated by a stunning blend of tart raspberries, tangy cranberries, and hints of lemon zest that offer an incredible balance of tartness and sweetness. The wine is very refreshing, light and has a supple, silky texture that is augmented by a lingering acidity. It beautifully represents the Old World style of winemaking, with great attention to detail, bringing forth a delightful and unique tasting experience. It pairs perfectly with a fresh salad, grilled seafood, light pasta dishes, or just enjoyed on its own as an aperitif. Overall, Soft Eyes Rosé is a must-try wine, offering exceptional quality and value. **Organic/Vegan!**



2022 Chillable Red Wine



"So Far Out" is an exciting new chillable red wine that is making waves in the wine world. Produced from organic and responsibly farmed grapes grown along California's central coast, this wine is the embodiment of a new wine revolution. Corvina (45%), Mourvèdre (30%), Grenache (20%), Charbono (5%) from Wilderness and Black Oak vineyards. Open top bin fermentation with native yeast. Aged in 95% stainless steel, 5% new oak. This red wine is light, refreshing and perfect served chilled, making it a perfect choice for those warm summer days at the beach, outdoor BBQs, or simply relaxing with friends. The blend, which is a closely guarded secret, is designed to highlight the characteristics of the terroir and the varietals used in the blend. With aromas of ripe red berries, and subtle hints of herbs, this wine is well balanced and smooth on the palate, with a light to medium body that is refreshing and juicy to the taste. The flavors are the perfect harmony of fruit, with hints of strawberry and raspberry and a slight acidity that lingers in the finish. "So Far Out" is the perfect wine for those who appreciate traditionally made, organic wine, and the push to move forward to a more sustainable future.
